- 4. Correspondence and Organizational Business

 - 4.1.1 Helen Langer Smith wrote about her concerns with vandalism and gunfire in the Dewatto area and the new "No Shooting" ordinance that was passed in Kitsap County.
 - 4.1.2 Heidi McCutcheon sent an application seeking appointment to the Lodging Tax Advisory Committee.
 - 4.1.3 Terri Jeffreys sent a letter of resignation from the Lodging Tax Advisory Committee.
 - 4.1.4 Dave Conzatti, of IBEW Local Union 76 wrote regarding concerns they had about the hospital expansion project and Berg electric.

- 8.3 Approval of the Interlocal Agreement with Kitsap County for hazardous waste services. The cost is \$60 per documented customer with an annual cap of \$45,000 and is funded in part by a Department of Ecology grant. The contract expires December 31, 2012.
- 8.4 Approval to transfer one acre of real property, tax parcel #12330 41 60010 by quitclaim deed from Mason County to Mason County Cemetery District 1 and to authorize the Chair of the Board of County Commissioners to sigh the deed. This is part of the Twin Firs Cemetery on Sand Hill Road near Belfair.
- 8.5 Approval of the Consolidated Contract C14956 Amendment 28, which increases the maximum consideration of the contract by \$35,871 to a total maximum of \$2,834,236. The change in the contract was made in the following programs: Children with Special Healthcare Needs add \$2,600; Ryan White HIV/AIDS case management add \$50,271; H1N1 Pandemic Flu Focus reduce \$29,000; and Small On-Site Septic Operation and Maintenance add \$12,000.
- 8.6 Approval to appoint Gary M. Nutt, Michael Petz, and Richard E. Smith to the Mason County Citizen Advisory Committee for the Shoreline Master Program Update.
