Item 8.1

Mr. Graham asked where the Boating Facilities Grant came from.

John Keates, Director of Facilities, Parks and Trails, commented that it is a state grant from boating fees and fuel tax.

Item 8.2

Mr. Graham questioned why the Veteran's Assistance Fund hadn't been giving out a lot of money the last few months.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson had the same observation and didn't know why, but could find out.

Item 8.11

Mr. Core asked if the Board followed the Mason County Personnel Manual, Chapter 3, Section 3.5, Page 8, when considering the promotion. The manual states that it will be posted on a bulletin board for all County staff to review and decide if they are going to apply. He asked if it was posted.

Karen Jackson, Human Resources Director, stated that it wasn't posted. It is her understanding that the Board can make direct appointments for a director.

Mr. Core noted that the manual doesn't say that and asked Ms. Jackson and the Board if they have read the policy lately.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson stated that she had, but not recently.

Mr. Core offered a copy.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson said that it is her understanding that they have the authority to make a direct appointment at the director level.

Mr. Core pointed out that it didn't say that anywhere in the manual and he was just curious. The manual stated that it must be posted in a spot that is familiar with County staff.

Ms. Jackson noted that direct appoints of directors was the practice in the past.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson confirmed that this had been the practice since 2005.

Mr. Core had another question regarding the budget of this position. He wanted to know if the DCD budget could actually take a load on of this additional outgoing cash flow. He observed that this person has been utilized for the main bargaining unit duties, which is the long range planning and permit planning. This was an exempt position and he thought the union should have looked at it.

Mr. Core mentioned that he wanted to make a statement about the matter.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson noted that Mr. Core's statement could wait until the Board voted on the Action Agenda, excluding item 8.11.

Cmmr. Sheldon/Lingle moved and seconded to approve Action items 8.1 through 8.10. Motion carried unanimously. RE-aye; S-aye; L-aye.

Mr. Core questioned if the Board was aware that this particular individual was also the person that critiqued and rewrote the job description to fit themselves. He offered a copy of the job description.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson stated that it was a request by the Board to do that.

Mr. Core pointed out that he heard that it was. He wanted it to be noted that it seemed unethical that they would consider a person for a job, but they also have that person write the job description and critique it and massage it in a way to fit their needs. He stated that didn't seem like a good practice to him.

Cmmr. Sheldon responded that he appreciated Mr. Core's comments but he thought that he made some assumptions that were not necessarily valid.

Mr. Core stated that he had a copy of the job description if anybody would actually like to read it. He had strikeouts and what was changed. It was on February 14th,2011.

Ms. Jackson responded that the job description had been modified since. She reviews all of them. She updated it and she had asked for the employee's input which she gave. She stated that Mr. Core probably didn't have the most recent copy of the job description.

Mr. Core noted that he probably doesn't have the most recent copy.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson commented that in addition to the review that was done, the Board referred it to their HR Director for finalization.

Mr. Core said that he was aware of that and had seen the path and saw how it came through. He wasn't aware that Ms. Jackson had modified it again. He knew that there was a big jag of it that was removed that the individual knew they weren't qualified for. He commented that was a statement from the individual herself; he didn't make that up.
