### July 24, 2012

- 1. Call to Order The Chairperson called the regular meeting to order at 6:03 p.m.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance Dave Loser led the flag salute.
- 3. Roll Call Present: Commissioner District 1 Lynda Ring Erickson; Commissioner District 2 Tim Sheldon; Commissioner District 3 Steve Bloomfield.
- 4. Correspondence and Organizational Business
  - 4.1 Correspondence
    - 4.1.1 The Washington State Liquor Control Board sent notice of a new liquor license application for the Shelton Moose Lodge.
    - 4.1.2 The Washington State Department of Natural Resources sent their projection of income from State Forest Lands.
    - 4.1.3 The Squaxin Island Tribe invited the Board to attend the Paddle to Squaxin 2012 event
  - 4.2 Dave Loser, ER&R, announced that a purchase order for \$11,781.00, plus tax, was issued to Sahlberg Equipment Co. of Buckley, WA for a new 9' Flink V Box spreader/sander.
  - 4.3 Mr. Loser also read a news release announcing that Mason County is seeking applicants for the Skokomish Flood Control Zone (FCZD) Advisory Committee.
  - 4.4 Cmmr. Bloomfield read a news release regarding the Paddle to Squaxin 2012 event.
