- 1. Call to Order The Chairperson called the regular meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance Tom Moore led the flag salute.
- 3. Roll Call Present: Commissioner District 1 Lynda Ring Erickson; Commissioner District 2 Tim Sheldon; Commissioner District 3 Steve Bloomfield.
- 4. Correspondence and Organizational Business
 - 4.1 Correspondence
 - 4.1.1 The Washington State Liquor Control Board sent notice of establishments in Mason County with liquor licenses due to expire on November 30, 2012.
 - 4.1.2 A petition was received requesting that the Commissioners stop any action to cause the Belfair Sewer System to extend into the Phase II area.
 - 4.1.3 Robert Miller was seeking clarification of the Belfair UGA Committee membership eligibility requirements.
 - 4.2 Dave Loser, Public Works, announced that a purchase order for \$15,057.60, plus tax, was issued to NC Machinery of Chehalis, WA for 30 five foot, 80 six foot and 60 seven foot cutting edges. In addition, a purchase order for \$4,152 was issued to Rebuilding & Hardfacing Inc. of Colville, WA for 12 carbide cutting edges.
- 5. Open Forum for Citizen Input
 - 5.1 Gerald Apple, Shelton School District, announced an upcoming event called "Celebrate My Drive". He invited the community to attend. Katie, a Shelton High School student, discussed the event.
 - 5.2 Tom Davis commented on recent rezone hearings. He didn't think enough information was being provided to the public on the hearing notices. He also thought the Commissioners shouldn't make their decisions on the same day of the hearings.
 - Cmmr. Sheldon reminded everyone that the open forum wasn't to be used as a political forum or to support or oppose any candidate.

- 7. Approval of Minutes There were no minutes to approve.

- 8.7 Approval of the 2163 Housing Fund grant to Educational Service District 113 in the amount of \$19,305, as recommended by the Mason County Housing Coalition.
- 8.8 Approval of the 2163 Housing Fund grant to the Mason County Shelter in the amount of \$16,000, as recommended by the Mason County Housing Coalition.
- 8.9 Approval of the reimbursable agreement for Mason County Public Works Road Department to provide work or services requested by the Facilities, Parks and Trails Department for maintenance services, emergency assistance, and fabrication of signs and materials.

Cmmr. Sheldon stated that he would like to table item 8.2 and to divide the question on item 8.6.

Cmmr. Bloomfield/Sheldon moved and seconded to approve action items 8.1 through 8.9, with the exception of items 8.2 and 8.6. Motion carried unanimously. RE-aye; S-aye; B-aye.

Cmmr. Sheldon/Bloomfield moved and seconded to table action item 8.2 to September 18, 2012. Motion carried unanimously. RE-aye; S-aye; B-aye.

Cmmr. Sheldon/Bloomfield moved and seconded to divide the question on item 8.6 to vote separately on the salary range adjustments. Motion carried unanimously. RE-aye; S-aye; B-aye.

Item 8.6

Cmmr. Sheldon/Bloomfield moved and seconded to amend the Non-Union Salary Range Alignment Table to reflect a salary range adjustment for the Deputy Administrator of Probation from Range 29 to 33. Motion carried unanimously. RE-aye; S-aye; B-aye.

Patricia Vandehey asked about the education and experience of the current Public Health Director.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson went over the Health Director's previous work experience. She didn't know what the Director's degree was in without having the transcript in front of her.

Constance Ibsen asked what additional responsibilities were added to the position and asked if the Board anticipated that any other additional responsibilities would be added.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson explained that the housing component was added along with staffing the 1/10th of 1% Mental Health Committee.

Constance Ibsen asked how the decision to implement the date of January 1, 2013 came about.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson wasn't sure but expected it would be so the change could be added to the budget for 2013.

Cmmr. Sheldon stated that he would vote no on the change. The item had been before the Board several times and he had voted no each time. He noted that the Director was Y rated when she was hired, meaning that she was paid more than the previous Director that was in that position. He didn't think it was fair to increase the Director's pay when the other elected officials have not received an increase.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson noted that a lot of duties were added to the position and other department directors were upgraded when they received additional duties.

Cmmr. Bloomfield/Ring Erickson moved and seconded to amend the Non-Union Salary Range Alignment Table to reflect a salary range adjustment for the Public Health and Human Services Director from Range 39 to 45. Motion carried. RE-aye; S-nay; B-aye.

- 9. 9:30 a.m. Public Hearings and Items Set for a Certain Time
 - 9.1 Public hearing to consider Resolution 12-05 submitted by Belfair Water District #1 regarding the annexation of Lots 1 through 24, Tract F and Lot B of the Plat of Clifton Ridge.

Barbara Adkins, Department of Community Development, explained that state law requires that the County Commissioners hold a public hearing within 60 days of the receipt of the resolution. Law also provides three criteria under which the Commissioners are to evaluate the approval of the annexation. The first criteria is whether the proposed action in the area under consideration is in compliance with the development program outlined in the County Comprehensive Plan. Review of the lots has demonstrated the provision of services to support development. The second criteria is whether the proposed action in the area under consideration is in compliance with basin wide water and sewage plans as approved by the State Department of Ecology and the State Department of Social and Health Services. The parcels appear to meet the eligibility criteria to receive both water and sewer. The last criteria is if the proposed action is in compliance with the policies expressed in the County plan for water and sewage facilities. The proposed area is in compliance and is inline with the concurrence policies of the Growth Management Act. The proposal met the criteria as outlined in State code and staff recommended approval of the annexation.

Cmmr. Sheldon asked if the proposal was identical to the proposal that was previously rejected by the Board.

Ms. Adkins replied that the previous proposal didn't include one parcel. The current proposal included all of the parcels in Clifton Ridge.

Public Testimony

Mike Pope, Belfair Water District No. 1 Commissioner, thanked the Board for considering the resolution. It had been a long time coming and the current manager had done his due diligence.

Ken VanBuskirk stated that the previous annexation proposal was a gross injustice and the Board now has the opportunity to correct it. It had been three years since the process started and he thanked the Board for their consideration.

Tom Peadon, General Manager for the Belfair Water District No. 1, stated that he reviewed the application for the annexation. He noted that he did verify all of the parcel numbers in the petition and they match up to the resolution. He also noted that the Belfair Water District currently serves all of the lots in the proposed annexation.

Cmmr. Sheldon felt that the County Commissioners did the right thing in rejecting the annexation proposal the first time because all of the lots were not included. He appreciated the new water district commission and the manager coming forward in a strait forward manner with the proposal.

Cmmr. Ring Erickson noted that the Growth Management Act required consistent service with density. The concern for the Commission with the previous petition was that it violated RCW by creating an island in the middle of the district that would not have representation. It was a pleasure to see a properly done petition before the Board that did not include any discrimination.

Motion carried unanimously. RE-aye; S-aye; B-aye. Resolution No. 65-12 (Exhibit C)

 - 10.1 Bob Simmons, WSU Extension, discussed the Master Gardeners program and announced upcoming events.
 - 10.2 Melody Peterson, Assessor, announced that reevaluation notices had gone out and encouraged anyone with questions to call her office.
 - 10.3 John Keates, Facilities and Parks, thanked the 4-H Forestry Program for their work at Sunset Bluff Park.
 - 10.4 Undersheriff Barrett thanked the summer volunteers at the Sheriff's office. He reminded everyone that speed emphasis patrols would take place when school started. He also thanked Public Works for two new Sheriff's vehicles and noted that there would also be an upcoming emphasis patrol on warrants.

- A Staff Report was prepared utilizing the criteria for evaluation and was provided to the Board for their consideration
- The Commissioners held a public hearing on August 21, 2012 to consider District's 5. Resolution 12-05 together with staff's report and public testimony.
- At the conclusion of the public hearing, Commissioners voted 3 to 00 to approve 6. District's Resolution 12-05 and approved the annexation of Lots 1 through 24, Tract F, and Lot B of the Plat of Clifton Ridge.
