#### April 23, 2013

- 1. Call to Order The Chairperson called the regular meeting to order at 6:01 a.m.
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance Justus Adkins led the flag salute.
- 3. Roll Call Present: Commissioner District 1 Randy Neatherlin; Commissioner District 3 Terri Jeffreys. Commissioner District 2 Tim Sheldon joined the meeting at 6:09 a.m.
- 4. Correspondence and Organizational Business
  - 4.1 Correspondence
    - 4.1.1 The Washington State Liquor Control Board sent notice of establishments in Mason County with liquor licenses due to expire on July 31, 2013.
    - 4.1.2 The Bureau of Indian Affairs received an application for acquisition of an 80.96 acre tract in Mason County to be held in trust for the Skokomish Indian Tribe.
    - 4.1.3 The Economic Development Council of Mason County submitted their first quarter report.
    - 4.1.4 Brian Kelly is seeking appointment to the Mason County Civil Service Commission.
    - 4.1.5 Jack Johnson is seeking appointment to the Belfair Sewer Advisory Committee.
  - 4.2 Martin Best, Emergency Management Manager, read a proclamation declaring April 25, 2013 as Volunteer Recognition Day.
  - 4.3 Cmmr. Neatherlin noted that there was an issue with public notice for a special meeting with the Department of Ecology last week. The press was not properly notified due to a staff oversight. No action was taken at the meeting.
- 5. Open Forum for Citizen Input -
  - 5.1 Don LeMaster owns a commercial building in Potlach in which a cannabis co-op is the sole tenant. An ordinance was recently passed that does not allow collective gardens in the Rural Commercial 2 zone. He felt the business was targeted for removal and the Rural Commercial 2 zone was arbitrarily removed from the allowed zoning. He asked that the ordinance be amended.
  - 5.2 Tom Davis commented on a letter that the Commissioners signed regarding a proposed park at Fudge Point. He didn't think it was appropriate for the Commissioners to speak on behalf of the public without the opportunity for the public to discuss the issue during the meeting.
  - 5.3 Patricia Vandehey discussed a meeting with Green Diamond Resources and Mason County Conservancy. She was concerned about Green Diamond's intentions.
  - 5.4 Bob Burbidge announced that there was a new youth program at the Fire District that involves the fire services, law enforcement and EMS.
  - 5.5 Todd Nelson read a letter of opposition regarding the new Collective Garden Ordinance.

### DECLARATION OF SURPLUS PROPERTY AND APPROVAL OF SALE

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the proceeds of the sale of said property are to be dedicated first to any delinquent property tax obligations and related penalties, expenses and assessments; and next to reimbursement of the Facilities and Parks fund for expenses of the Property Manager; and finally to the Reserve for Accrued Leave Fund; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the property manager is authorized to sign the related bid form and Purchase and Sale Agreement and the Treasurer is authorized to sign the County Treasurer's Deed.

# A RESOLUTION of the Mason County Board of Commissioners Accepting the Belfair Sewer Get Connected Phase 1 Gravity Sewer Project as Complete.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Mason County (Board) approved the Belfair Wastewater Treatment and Water Reclamation Facility project for the Belfair Urban Growth Area (UGA); and

WHEREAS, a part of construction of the Belfair Wastewater Treatment and Water Reclamation Facility project included construction of sewage collection main lines within the Phase 1 area of the Belfair UGA; and

WHEREAS, the County received grant and loan funding from the State Department of Ecology to extend public sewers along a number of side streets and driveways within the Phase 1 area of the Belfair UGA; and

WHEREAS, at their April 10, 2012 regular meeting, the Board authorized bidding and award of a contract for construction of the Belfair Sewer Get Connected Phase 1 Gravity Sewer Project; and

WHEREAS, bids for the Belfair Sewer Get Connected Phase 1 Gravity Sewer Project were received and opened on Thursday, May 24, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the contract for construction of the Belfair Sewer Get Connected Phase 1 Gravity Sewer Project was awarded to Sound Excavation, Inc., the lowest responsible & responsive bidder on the project, in the total amount of \$569,959.84, including all applicable sales taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Belfair Sewer Get Connected Phase 1 Gravity Sewer Project has been completed for a total construction cost of \$571,361.85, including all applicable sales taxes, a slight project cost increase of 0.25%; and

WHEREAS, the Belfair Sewer Get Connected Phase 1 Gravity Sewer Project has been completed in accordance with the project plans and specifications; and

WHEREAS, the Belfair Sewer Get Connected Phase 1 Gravity Sewer Project construction has been approved by representatives of ESA, Inc., the project's Project Engineer of Record, and by the County's Public Works Department, Utilities & Waste Management Division; and

WHEREAS, no contractor claims have been filed against Mason County relative to the Belfair Sewer Get Connected Phase 1 Gravity Sewer Project;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mason County Commissioners hereby accept the Belfair Sewer Get Connected Phase 1 Gravity Sewer Project as complete.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Director of the Mason County Public Works Department is hereby authorized to complete the contract closure process upon receiving appropriate clearances from the Department of Revenue and the Department of Employment Security.
