- 4. Correspondence and Organizational Business
 - 4.1 Correspondence
 - 4.1.1 The Mason County Treasurer provided notice of a property tax refunds.
 - 4.1.2 The United States Secretary of the Interior sent notice of Mason County's Payment in Lieu of Taxes for 2013.
 - 4.1.3 The Washington State Liquor Control Board sent notice of a special occasion liquor license application for the Mason County Rodeo Association and notice of an application for added privilege for Hama Hama Company.
- 5. Open Forum for Citizen Input
 - 5.1 Jessica Schreiber spoke in support of saving the Mason County Fairgrounds. She provided a history of the fairgrounds and submitted her written testimony for the record.
 - 5.2 Annette McGee urged the Board to send a letter to the Port of Shelton asking them to reduce the lease fees for the fair to below market value. She cited RCW 14.08.120, which would allow them to do so.
 - 5.3 Terri King, WA Sea Grant, invited the Board and the public to attend the Family Fun with the Sea Stars event on July 4th.
 - 5.4 Patricia Vandehey read a letter from the Thurston County Commissioners to the Washington State Investment Board regarding investment in fossil fuel companies.
 - 5.5 Annette McGee invited the Board and the public to attend the Historical Society car show and fundraiser.

8. Approval of Action Agenda:
