

WHEREAS, littoral erosion at many locations along the north bank of Hood Canal between Stimson Creek and Rendsland Creek, caused by high tides and severe winds since December 17, 1982, has dangerously decreased the effective width of the North Shore Road, County Road No. 7039, in many locations between approximate M.P. 1.40 to M.P. 15.02 ; and

WHEREAS, a continuation of this erosion to the complete destruction of the road seems inevitable if unchecked, and

WHEREAS, immediate revetment of the bank above mean high water and restoration of the road is necessary in the public interest, and

WHEREAS, the necessary earth and rock revetment above the mean high water being, in effect, maintenance work restorative in character will constitute a minor action resulting in NO significant effect on the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the repairs adjacent to County Road No. 7039 shall be considered an emergency, and **under** authority granted by RCW 36.32.280

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Engineer is hereby authorized and directed to proceed with the work at once, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no permit is required under the Shorelines Management Act.
